
Pedal Prix

On the weekend, our Pedal Prix team competed in the first race of the season, an eight-hour race at McNamara Park, Mt Gambier. The team consisted of three members from 2023 and four new students who pedaled Blue Thunder around the 2.4km track. They performed very well in the hot conditions, finishing 2nd in their division; completing a total of 72 laps (173km)- that was 21 laps more than the previous year. Susan McLean Cybersafety Workshops

Thanks to our Governing Council and the Wrattonbully Partnership, we are fortunate to have Susan McLean come to Naracoorte in April. The Year 3-6 students will be attending sessions in their cohorts at the High School. Content includes:

- Rules and Laws
- Cyberbullying
- Online 'friends'
- Sites & apps that children are using and what are the age requirements for each site
- Staying safe online
- How to be a good Digital Citizen

She will be running a <u>free parent workshop</u> on Thursday April **4**th at 7:00pm at the Naracoorte High School Library. It is described as:

An informative & entertaining session for Parents and carers is delivered with Susan's famous 'no-nonsense' approach and will cover the positive benefits of technology, as well as what parents need to be aware of.

Education Management System and Class Dojo

The school is switching over to the new Education Management System (EMS) on April 4th as per Department guidelines. This will have some immediate changes, such as electronic sign in/out for students and a new finance system. There is also a component that offers communication options with parents, similar to Audiri and Dojo. As we become more familiar with the system, we may elect to use these approved free options to replace the existing apps and tools. In the meantime, we will continue to use Class Dojo as our sole class/parent portal. Please be aware that there is no requirement to purchase the premium option. We apologise for any confusion this may have caused.

Camps

Since the Year 7 move to High School and COVID, the camp routine has been everchanging. We have been looking to have a set plan for 2025 and beyond. We would move from previously having a Yr 5 and 7 camp to having a Yr 4 and 6 camp. Camps for Year 5 and 6 have already been booked for

this year. In order to align for future years, we are hoping to have a shorter Year 4 camp this year, so that cohort doesn't miss out. This is subject to finding a suitable camp at the right time of year. Once dates are know, we will inform parents so you are aware of costs well in advance.

Parking and Kiss and Drop

The end of day is a very busy time around the school. We are aware there are limited parking options, particularly with the Moore Street changes. We are able to provide the kiss'n'drop option which alleviates a lot of the pick-up stress.

However, teachers on duty are reporting regular unsafe practices around these spaces. The kiss and drop road is not a parking area and is unsafe to do so. The staff holding the lollipops are directing traffic for the safety of students. Please follow their directions so we can avoid an accident.


The students are really enjoying this new play space. It's certainly a very popular place to be at recess and lunch times!









