

Over the past few days I attended the Education Leader's Day and Numeracy Summit in Adelaide. One of the underlying messages that is reflected in the *Strategy for Public Education* is about focusing on the whole child and preparing them for the modern world. Literacy and Numeracy skills are still key elements of schooling, but dispositions such as creativity, curiosity, discernment and judgement and self-regulation alongside wellbeing and sense of self are also critical. The skills we need our students leaving primary school and then secondary school with go beyond literacy and numeracy.

To help include the voice of the parent community, one question I would like to explore is what skills, knowledge and dispositions do you want your children to have when they graduate from Naracoorte Primary School?

### **Playground Opening**

Tomorrow we will officially open the new playground at 10.30am. It has been a wonderful addition to our school. It has been very popular and provides our school community with a great space to be active, immerse in creative play and develop gross motor skills. This project wouldn't have been possible without the efforts of the Governing Council and Rob Sandercock.

#### Interviews

This term we will be having interviews in Week 9 which is the week starting **Monday March 25**<sup>th</sup>. We are using an **online booking system** which will make it a lot easier for parents and staff to coordinate interviews. The smooth running of this event requires us all to keep to a schedule and end the interview in a timely manner. ### NAPLAN

Last week our Year 3 and 5 students participated in the NAPLAN readiness test which tested the platform and allowed them to become familiar with the format and how the platform works. The actual assessments have 4 components and will be done on the **13**<sup>th</sup>, **14**<sup>th</sup>, **18**<sup>th</sup> **and 19**<sup>th</sup> **March** with catch up assessments done between the 15<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

#### Smoke-free and vape-free areas – new regulations

From 1 March 2024 new regulations will extend the smokefree and vape-free areas to within 10 metres of site boundaries.

This includes:

 $\cdot$  school drop-off and pick-up zones that are within 10 metres of the school fence, gate or boundary

 $\cdot$  school ovals and sporting fields and within 10 metres of the boundary of the oval or sporting field

• footpaths, roads, public nature strips and public recreation areas that are within 10 metres of a school boundary.

The department's <u>Smoke-free policy</u> (PDF 419 KB) has been updated to incorporate the new regulations.

The students at assembly on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> Feb were presented with a graduation bear kindly paid for by an anonymous beneficiary to the program through the Adelaide University. They were excited and proud to have their learning journeys acknowledged once again.

This is an extra-curricular program that encourages students to be lifelong learners and engage in opportunities around them. Each student recorded and demonstrated a minimum of 30 hours in their first year, with hours accumulating as the students continue annually.

## **Numeracy At Home**

One of the most important modes of enhancing children's understanding of Maths is having Maths discussions. The more you can talk about number, shape and patterns at home with your children that is connected to what you are doing at the time, the better their understanding and connections will be.

Take subitising for example. Subitising is the ability to look at a small set of objects and instantly know how many there are without counting them. For example, when rolling a dice we don't need to count the dots to know what we have rolled.

For young children, the more you refer to different objects in groups, the better their number sense develops. This is very different to one on one correspondence (ie pointing and counting) or fast counting - it should be instant.

Opportunities are boundless in the home. We collected 3 eggs, 5 apples in the bowl, 2 shoes, 6 tennis balls etc. This gives children very good grounding and an important stepping stone for key numeracy concepts.

#### Play is the Way

This is a program used in all year levels at our school. You may hear the teachers and students talk about the guiding concepts that are embedded into our



school culture. We have a school focus on one of these each fortnight.

They are:

- The Golden Rule treat others as you would like them to treat you
- 2. Be brave participate to progress
- 3. Pursue your personal best no matter who you work with
- 4. Have reasons for the things you say and do
- 5. It takes great strength to be sensible

Play is the Way is a social and emotional learning (SEL) methodology using physically interactive games & activities, 5 guiding concepts, an empowering self-reflective language and 6 key virtues that form a pathway to empathy.

It is a process that gives primary schools a way to develop, improve and entrench the personal and social capabilities of students.


