Finally, we will be hosting a Literacy information session with Jo Culf (Literacy Guarantee Unit literacy coach) to share our literacy programs and how to support your children at home. This will be on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September.

#### **Community Portal**

With the introduction of EMS as the school's management system, we are starting to use more of the connected applications to streamline our systems. This will mean for the short term there will be lots of options, apps, communication methods until we phase out some of the older ones at the end of the year. I understand this can be confusing so we thank you for your patience and adaptability to the new system.

The Community portal was introduced late last term and is where student reports are published to. There is now a student absence component where you can submit an absence as well as check on previous absences. It is currently run through a URL until an app is created. This can be saved on your home screen / desktop. We will send out a cheat sheet via email on how to do this. This should be a quick and easy way to submit an absence for parents.

#### **Staffing Update**

I would like to congratulate Lucy Possingham who was the successful applicant for the Deputy Principal position from 2025-2029. Lucy has currently been in the Deputy role at Reidy Park PS and is very much looking forward to returning to Naracoorte Primary School and being part of the leadership team.

#### **NAPLAN** results

Last week the NAPLAN reports went home to families of students in Yr 3 and 5. Overall as a school our results were quite pleasing. Whilst it is hard to compare one cohort of students from another, the large groups do allow for us to gauge general trends.

Year 3 writing was a standout improvement area and strength, whilst numeracy was a strength in Year 5. We will focus on grammar and language conventions as an area to improve. The implementation of the Department spelling and morphology program should improve students' understanding and knowledge of language conventions. More about this program will be shared at the Parent Literacy night late this term.

#### Camps

#### **Bullying No Way Week of Action**

#### Mindfulness at lunchtime



Both Hattie and Jess were extremely grateful and appreciative of the support shown.










Monday 19th August 2024, 4:30 - 6:00pm at Wortley Oval, Naracoorte
