### **Regional Education Gathering**

On August 9<sup>th</sup>, all education staff in the Blue Lake and Wrattonbully Partnership gathered for one of the biggest events held in the South East. Over 900 educators got the opportunity to listen to CE Martin Westwell and well-renown educational expert, Pasi Sahlberg, speak.

Pasi spoke about the positive direction of education in SA being focused around developing the child holistically. He embedded strong research around three key factors to improve outcomes and the wellbeing of young people. These include:

- The concept of teacher looping- children having the same teacher for more than one year to develop stronger relationships.
- Building relationships through recess and free playthe idea of being creative with school timetables to allow breaks for play and relationship building.
- Belonging creating ways to create a sense of belonging in schools.

These messages were echoed by Martin Westwell when he spoke about the connection between higher performing students and their sense of belonging to school, relationship with teachers and their ability to persevere and be creative.

At Naracoorte PS, we follow these principles and value the above elements of education. We will continue to be innovative in the ways we can continue to develop these ideas.

#### **Literacy Evening**

On **Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September from 6:30-8:00pm**, we will be holding a Literacy evening to share current literacy practices and how parents can support literacy at home. Presented by Literacy Guarantee Unit Coach, Jo Culf, and school staff, we are hoping this informative session will help parents to have a greater understanding of how literacy learning looks at school in the current era from Reception to Year 6.

#### **Progressive Achievement Testing**

Students from Yr 2-6 will be involved in PAT assessments in Reading and Maths during the last four weeks of term. There is only one test for each subject and they are completed online in the child's class. The results are used internally to look at student progress and areas of strength and development across a cohort.

#### **Maths Afternoon**

As part of Literacy and Numeracy week, we will be having a Maths afternoon, where parents, grandparents and significant others are invited to join in. This will be held on **Friday 30<sup>th</sup> August** from **2:30- 3:15pm.** We look forward to a mathmagical afternoon!

#### **School Camps**

The Year 5 and 6 camps are not far away! On Tuesday September 17<sup>th</sup>, students in Year 5 will head East to Ballarat and the Year 6s will head west to Adelaide as part of the 2024 camp program. I am sure they will have an amazing experience!



# **Using Community Portal**



# Option 1: Adding Community Portal URL as a Favourite on your iOS device






This is how the "app icon" will appear on your home page.










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







# What can I see in Community Portal

In Community Portal when you log in it will come up with Welcome (Parent Name) then have My Student. This has their photo and name (see photo 1). If you click on your student you can then click on Attendance and this will show their attendance summary with a pie graph of the break down (photo 2). If you then scroll to the right you can click on Academic Results and this will show your students school reports. (Photo 3) We will communicate with families as we add more options.












# Requesting an Absence...

In Community Portal when you log in it will come up with Welcome (Parent Name) then have My Student. This has their photo and name (see photo 1). From here you can select Request an Absence, this will then take you to the next screen where you "Apply for Absence" (see photo 2). Once you have filled in all the details hit Submit Application. This will then pop up with a message saying thank you for applying for the absence. Unfortunately at the moment no notifications are coming through to parents as the message suggests, this is a feature we are hoping will be updated soon.
