It has been a very busy first few weeks already! In the first week back we had the Colour Run which despite the cool and damp conditions, was very successful. It was great to see lots of family members and friends come along to support the event. We also very proudly presented our student learning in the show display at the Naracoorte Show. We were awarded the best school display which is a nice recognition for the work the teachers and students put in.

Last Friday night we had our choir perform in Mt Gambier at the South East Music Festival. They did a great job in front of a sold-out audience. Well done to Isla, Savannah, Karle and Vivian for performing their solos so brilliantly and to Matilda for her amazing job as one of the hosts. Thanks to Ms Gale for her work as Choir Coordinator and also to our assistants, Oriel Martyn and Erika Vickery.

On Monday, we had the last of our Pupil Free Days for the term. The teaching staff worked on moderation of work samples, assessment and setting up for reporting. The end of year report will be emailed and pushed out to the Community Portal. If you haven't signed up for the Community Portal yet, please speak to the office about how to do this.

#### Sports Day

Next **Friday, November 8**<sup>th</sup>, is Sports Day. The students have been actively practising during PE lessons and the try outs for all the age races have been held. Your child should have received notes with the program and other Sport Day details. We look forward to a great day and having lots of family and friends come along. A big thanks to Mrs Donnelly for all her efforts in organising and preparing for the day.

#### Planning for 2025

We are in full swing of preparing for 2025. We have a large group of Year 6s moving to high school which will reduce numbers in Upper Primary. Consequently, we will reduce from four to three Year 5/6 classes. The rest will remain fairly consistent. Therefore, the make up of the school will be:

- 3 x Reception
- 3 x Year 1/2
- 3 x Year 3/4
- 3 x Year 5/6

Teaching staff for these classes have not been allocated yet.

We will also be making some changes to teaching spaces in line with recent research into what learning environments are best for students, connecting teaching teams and best fit for learning spaces. As a result, these changes will see the Pond (reception classes) remain where they are, the Yr 1/2 students move to the Hive, the Year 3/4 students move to the main building in the corridor classrooms and the Year 5/6 students move to one collaborative learning space in the current Garden area. Specialist subjects, Science, Indonesian and ICT will operate out of the STEM space, in what will be a multipurpose hub. Whilst these changes will be significant for some, the benefit for learning across the school will be positive.

Leadership has met with teachers to gather feedback in regards to placing students in classes for next year. Students from Year 1 up were also asked to nominate students they wanted in their class. Over the next few weeks the lists will be reviewed and modified until final allocations are sorted.

Parents will be informed of their child's class placement prior to transition in Week 8.

#### Student Leaders 2025

Being a student leader is a privilege and one of the highest honours that can be earnt at Primary School. Each year, four students get the opportunity to be elected as a student leader. The four positions are not gender specific, and all positions will be filled on merit.

The process to be a student leader in 2025 will begin shortly, with selections made prior to the end of this school year so that this year's leaders can pass over the baton and train them. Information regarding the timeline and process for students to nominate as a student leader will be shared in the next few weeks.

All other student leadership positions, such as house captains, will open for nomination at the start of next year.

#### NPSfest 2025

Last year we celebrated the end of the year with Carols on the Green. This year we are going to run with a very similar format on **Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December**. However, it wont be carols this year, it will be any choice of song. The more relaxed style of concert had positive feedback so we are hoping this will again be a popular event. The committee is still formalising details, but we will be inviting outside vendors to supply food options for families. More details to come!



#### **COLOUR RUN**

On Friday, October 18th, we held our annual Colour Run, and it was a fantastic event! After a solid morning of rain, the weather turned in our favour, and the light drizzle added to the fun, helping the colours stick to everyone. Every student who participated wore the biggest smiles as they ran, jogged, or walked the 500-metre track, getting showered with colourful powder along the way.

A big thank you goes to Ange Donnelly, who dedicated her time to help set up the event, and to the parents who assisted in distributing the colour. We also appreciate Helen Michael and her team for running the BBQ.

Lastly, a huge thank you to the staff who supported the event and to all the students for their participation and hard work in raising funds for our school.

It would be fantastic if all the students could raise a few dollars each as the money will be spent on our school. The SRC has many suggestions to enhance our school, such as installing extra water fountains and purchasing additional play equipment.

We are asking for donations of local fuel and food vouchers, new gifts (for example toys and books) and any non-perishable food.



#### 2025 Material & Services Charge

Dear Parents/Caregivers

Listed above is the proposed "Notice of Charges" for our Reception - Year 6 students for 2025.

The "Notice of Charges" provides a breakdown of the Materials and Services Charge. The 2025 charge for Naracoorte Primary School is \$340 per student.

Once again students attending public schools in 2025 will receive a discount for their M&S Fees. The discount has increased to \$200, bringing the proposed amount payable per student to **\$140** (\$340 less \$200 discount). F.Y.I

The 2025 proposed amount payable has reduced from \$215 for 2024, to **\$140**.

The proposed Materials and Services Charge for 2025 will be presented at the next Governing Council meeting, to be held on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December at 6:00pm for discussion and voting.

Accordingly, parents/caregivers are invited to attend this meeting. Please note that voting is restricted only to elected members of the Governing Council.


