As the year comes to an end, I would like to thank Andrea Lawrie for her tremendous contribution as Deputy Principal over the past four years. Andrea's tenure as Deputy finishes, but she will remain at NPS and will be returning to the classroom. Andrea's dedication and commitment to supporting students who require additional support cannot be understated.

Classes, transition and classroom moves

Today, your child will receive a letter with details of their class placement for 2025. There has been an incredible amount of effort gone into the class placement exercise and it is impossible to meet all teacher suggestions and student friendship requests. However, we have done the best we can to ensure the needs of all students are taken into account, with feedback from teachers an important part of the process. *If you didn't receive the letter for any reason, please contact the office and we will arrange a way for you to get an additional one.*

The transition day will enable them to spend the day on Thursday with their new teacher. This is an excellent opportunity to not only get to know each other better but to spend time with their peers.

Kindy Transition began today with their second day tomorrow. Naracoorte High School have their transition tomorrow and Friday. Students will need to start the day at High school just like they would in 2025.

As set out in the first newsletter for the term, we have restructured how the school will be set up. There will be a map of the new spaces in the placement letter sent home to assist.

Staff have already started cleaning and reducing resources as they prepare for the move. We will have a moving day next Thursday where boxes of resources and furniture will be moved. Setting up of rooms will continue in school holidays ready for next year.



BOOK COLLECTION 2025

Dates and times for the collection of books for 2025 are **9.30am - 3.00pm** on **Wednesday 22nd and Thursday 23rd January.**

Your materials and services charges invoice for \$340 per student will be emailed to you. School Card funding applications for low-income earners can be completed online sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard from early January 2025.

Please note that school will begin back on **Wednesday January 29th** for students at NPS as Tuesday will be a Pupil Free Day.



In 2025, we will be setting up our Targeted Learning Centre. The final parameters of how this space will work are still being investigated, but it will be a great opportunity for some of our students to get more time in a targeted intervention space. Ms Lawrie will be the lead teacher in this space.

Graduation

Next Wednesday night is graduation for your Year 6 students. This should be a great celebration of the completion of Primary school. Following dinner, there will be a short graduation ceremony back at school.

As well as the graduation itself, we will be presenting the end of year awards. As well as the usual MacKillop Award, we have decided to add an additional two awards. These being for:

- Academic excellence
- Continuous Improvement (Sponsored by Smiles All Round)

We believe this gives us a good balance of awards that recognise attributes that we feel are an important part of what we want to see in our graduating students.

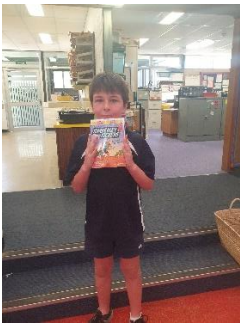

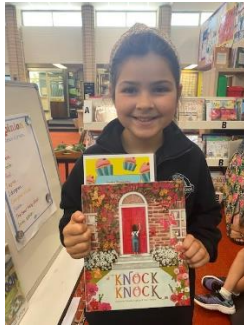
Birthday Book Club

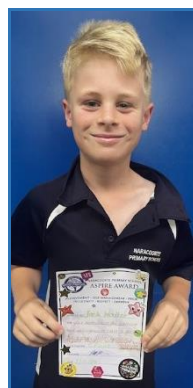
